The HCSMCC celebrates the legacy of those that advocated for equitable access to education for African American students in Harford County. The 100-year-old Colored School began as a two-room structure serving primary grade students and later expanded to become the first school in Harford County that provided high school education for African American students. The HCSMCC provides an opportunity for those who are interested in African American culture to explore and revel in this history through the museum's exhibits and historical displays. Programs and events throughout the year highlight the rich and diverse history of the African American community in Harford County and Havre de Grace.

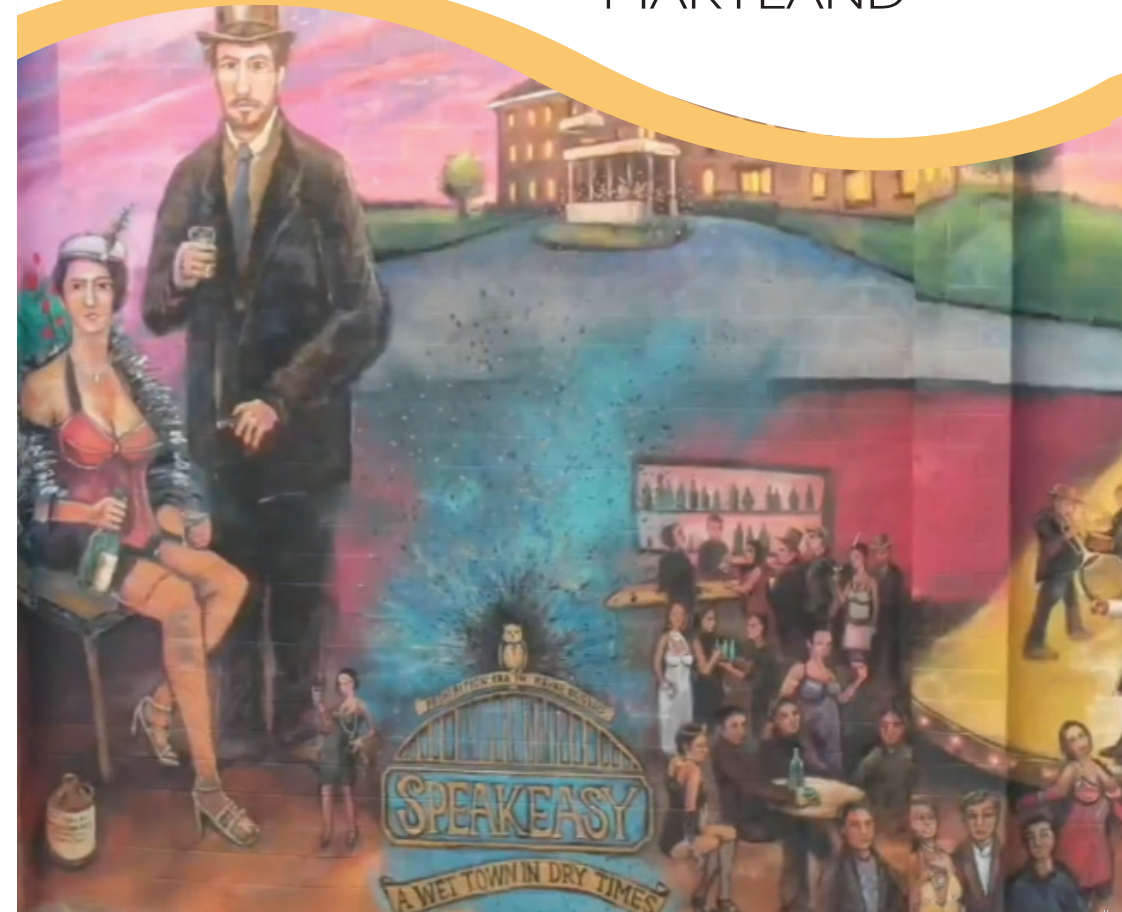

Concord Point Lighthouse & Keeper's House Museum

The Concord Point Lighthouse is the second oldest lighthouse in Maryland and the symbol of Havre de Grace. Built in 1827, the lighthouse served as a beacon for sailors in the Upper Chesapeake Bay until being decommissioned in 1975. The Lighthouse property anchors one end of Havre de Grace's beautiful waterfront promenade. The views are spectacular! Thus, it is a popular site for wedding ceremonies and special events. The Lighthouse and the Keeper's House Museum & Gift Shop are open for public tours and pre-arranged private tours April through October.

Hosanna School Museum is a restored Freedmen's Bureau School built in 1867; it served as the first public school for African Americans in Harford County. Its mission is to collect, preserve, and interpret the history of Harford County, Maryland through the lens of the African American experience within national contexts. It is known for its annual regional Juneteenth Festival and Underground Railroad tours.

Built in 1840, the Lock House served as home to the lock tender and his family and as the office of the toll collector of the Susquehanna and Tidewater Canal which was in operation from 1840 into the 1890s. Today the Lock House Museum, located in North Park and situated on the banks of the Susquehanna River, displays exhibits about the nineteenth century canal including the toll collector's office, a working scale model lock, life in the lock house in the mid-1850s, and the newly renovated upstairs exhibits on the economic impact of the canal on the region and the villages and communities along its 45-mile stretch.
