While many of the tourists visit the historical sites located within the city, once here they will find that there is much to offer those interested in the outdoors. Located on the Harford County shoreline at the mouth of the Susquehanna River, strolling the Promenade will quickly provide you with a memorable and enjoyable view of the many outdoor activities this beautiful waterfront community has to offer – sailing, kayaking, motor boats, canoeing, and parasailing.

For the fishermen the city offers quick access to the great Susquehanna Flats and one of the east coast's best Upper Chesapeake Bay fisheries – a brief stay is more of a brief experience of PARADISE! In May of 2004 Readers Digest Magazine (America's Best 100 New Discoveries) listed Havre de Grace, MD. as the number one destination for anglers in search of the ever smart & elusive Largemouth Bass. The quote from the article cited the region as producing largemouth bass to seventeen pounds. It is believed by most anglers in the area that they were referring to the spring migration of striped bass locally known as rockfish. It is not uncommon for anglers to catch Rockfish, in excess of 40 pounds during the Spring "Catch & Release" season. The bass fisherman will not be disappointed. It is normal for a five fish limit of bass in a tournament in the area to weigh as much as twenty pounds. In the fall of the year the area regularly has produced an eight pound largemouth. In the fall of 2008 the area produced an 8.99 pound largemouth during a local U. S. Anglers Choice Team Tournament caught by the team of Joe Thompson and Jerry Gerlach, quite a catch for a tidal river fishery. I look for 2009 to produce a nine pound largemouth bass in this area and make some lucky angler proud. But you have to get out there and fish to have a chance at catching him.
